Report On Crisis Care Kit Trip #6

The final box count was: 19 clothing and miscellaneous boxes, 95 Crisis Care Kit boxes and 5 School Pal Paks. That's our largest load so far and 2 times more than last spring's load.

We departed Sunday, March 21, after church. We lost a bit of time while traveling out -- one of our tarps developed a tear and began to rip and flap in the wind as we drove down the road. We made 3 stops and finally got it clamped and fixed in place in order to make the rest of the trip. We got to the PA Turnpike exit, spotted the nearest hotel and stopped for the night (2:00 a.m.).

We got up the next morning and down to the warehouse (an hour's drive) by 9:15 before the rain set in and before breakfast. We were unloaded in an hour. We made a couple of stops on the way back and managed to get home without incident around midnight, Monday, March 22.

A few things to note: 1. Boxes that are delivered by truck (like we're doing) don't have to be taped up -- only if they are sent via UPS or postal mail. 2. Everyone that donated a box needs to follow up with their financial

payment to NCM. For Crisis Care Kits: \$12/box to ACM1297. For School Pal Paks: \$10/box to ACM1788 and for clothing: ACM1259 (\$8 for light clothing, \$7 for heavy clothing).

The warehouse was pretty full. Shipping containers are being loaded almost weekly. The Chilean government has not reduced duty charges on in-coming relief shipments. Our Church does not ship to countries that charge duties -- they can increase the duty charge after the payment and even while it is sitting on the dock (I imagine that creates quite a bind.) We need to pray that Chile will change its policies in this area.

May Emphasis

MISSIONARY HEALTH CARE

The cost of keeping missionaries healthy so they can do their jobs is quite high, and the cost continues to rise. To help defray those costs, the Nazarene Missions International developed the NMI Missionary Health Care (formerly Medical Plan).

Missionary Health Care helps pay for the medical expenses of Nazarene missionaries. It accounts for about 25% of the total medical expenses (approximately \$500,000). Hopefully, with increased awareness of and participation in the Missionary Health Care, that amount will increase.

What is Missionary Health Care, and why should I give to it?

Missionary Health Care (MHC) is an opportunity to help with the health care costs of Nazarene missionaries. MHC allows missionaries to focus on their work without raising funds to pay for medical care. The money comes from Distinguished Service Awards (DSAs), Memorial Rolls (MRs), Gifts from the Heart, or plate offerings.

What are the Distinguished Service Award and the Memorial Roll?

The Distinguished Service Award recognizes someone (living) who has served or is serving the church. It may be presented by the church or a group within the church (not individuals). The Memorial Roll is a record of people who have been memorialized by gifts to the Medical Plan. It is kept in the General NMI Office and is a significant way to honor the deceased (members of the local church or not) and may be presented by groups or individuals. Both of these honors are accompanied by attractive certificates stating the recipient and—in the case of a DSA—the reason for presentation.

What is Gifts From the Heart?

Gifts From the Heart is a facet of Medical Plan that allows individuals to give to Missionary Health Care. People may be honored or memorialized with an attractive card noting the monetary gift to Missionary Health Care (the donor chooses the amount). Look for the display in your church. Take a card from the rack and follow the instructions. If you do not see a Gifts From the Heart display at your church, ask your local or district NMI president.

Plate Offering

If a church does not purchase a DSA or MR during the year, a plate offering should be received for Missionary Health Care. With everyone participating, we can effectively care for the health care needs of our missionaries.
