The greatest and often the last thing surrendered to God is

God desires to use you not for your glory, but for His!

Before we can be effectively used by God we need to encounter Him. This begins by entering into his Presence where we quickly discover our sin and our need for Him. Repentance is our response, and obedience to His call is the by-product. Before we do anything for God we must begin allowing God to do His work in us.

Read Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted, and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying.

And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

"Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty." Then one of the seraphs flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar.

With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

Have you recently experienced the awesome presence and holiness of God?

What have you discovered about yourself in that encounter?

Are you more interested in what you are doing for God
than what you are becoming?

Is there anything within you that God longs to clean or purify?

Psalm 27:1-14

The LORD is my light and my salvation-- whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life-- of whom shall I be afraid? When evil men advance against me to devour my flesh, when my enemies and my foes attack me, they will stumble and fall.

Though an army besiege me, my heart will not fear; though war break out against me, even then will I be confident. One thing I ask of the LORD, this is what I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to seek him in his temple.

And even if it was true, did I glorify God by sharing it with others?

Did I spend time praying for those involved?

Is my mind and heart open, honest, and clean before God?

Am I faithful to my wedding vows? In deed? In thought?

Is my home a good testimony for Jesus?

Is my family a good witness for a lost world?

Am I willing to forgive any and all wrongs committed against my family or me?

Do I have any secret sin that I excuse which needs forgiveness?

Have I forgiven those who have talked about me?

Did I meet every circumstance of today as Jesus would?

Am I worried or over-anxious about things I have no control over?

Do I fret and complain?

Am I guilty of the sin of unbelief?

Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one. For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.

Matthew 6:12-15

For in the day of trouble he will keep me safe in his dwelling; he will hide me in the shelter of his tabernacle and set me high upon a rock.

Then my head will be exalted above the enemies who surround me; at his tabernacle will I sacrifice with shouts of joy; I will sing and make music to the LORD. Hear my voice when I call, O LORD; be merciful to me & answer me. My heart says of you, "Seek his face!" Your face, LORD, I will seek.

Do not hide your face from me, do not turn your servant away in anger; you have been my helper. Do not reject me or forsake me, O God my Savior.

Though my father & mother forsake me, the LORD will receive me. Teach me your way, O LORD; lead me in a straight path because of my oppressors. Do not turn me over to the desire of my foes, for false witnesses rise up against me, breathing out violence.

I am still confident of this: I will see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living. Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart and wait for the LORD.

Upon doing God's work we will encounter opposition, trials and temptations. Upon whom will you place your trust? To whom do you go when life brings its difficulties and pain? What might you even now give to God?

Psalm 84:1-12

How lovely is your dwelling place, O LORD Almighty! My soul yearns, even faints, for the courts of the LORD; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God.

Even the sparrow has found a home, and the swallow a nest for herself where she may have her young-- a place near your altar, O LORD Almighty, my King and my God. Blessed are those who dwell in your house; they are ever praising you. Selah

Blessed are those whose strength is in you, who have set their hearts on pilgrimage. As they pass through the Valley of Baca, they make it a place of springs; the autumn rains also cover it with pools. They go from strength to strength, till each appears before God in Zion. Hear my prayer, O LORD God Almighty; listen to me, O God of Jacob. Selah

Look upon our shield, O God; look with favor on your anointed one. Better is one day in your courts than a thousand elsewhere; I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of the wicked.

For the LORD God is a sun and shield; the LORD bestows favor and honor; no good thing does he withhold from those whose walk is blameless. O LORD Almighty, blessed is the man who trusts in you.

Psalm 19:1-14

MAKE TIME TO CONFESS

There are three kinds of sins that we should confess.

- 1. **PRIVATE** These are sins committed against God alone. They need to be confessed to Him alone.
- 2. **PERSONAL** Sins against others. There will be no peace or restoration until these sins are confessed to God.

And as God leads, you may have to ask for forgiveness of others you have wronged and hurt. It is your responsibility to restore, heal, and to make things right.

3. *PUBLIC* - These sins are against the Church, the Body of Believers.

They include such things as ...

gossip slander apathy bad attitudes

You can think and name many others.

If these sins are not confessed, revival, renewal, and God's peace will not come. God uses pure vessels to accomplish His will! The Church needs more than organization and manpower; it needs the power of God flowing through each one of us!

Sin separates us from God and keeps Him from using us the way He desires!

If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

Psalm 51:1-19

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.
