You Are Part Of Something BIG!

The Church of the Nazarene ministers in 162 world areas. The 2017 General Board approved the following world areas entered: Mesoamerica Region—Curaçao; Asia-Pacific Region—Singapore and Mongolia.*

700 missionaries and 309 missionary kids were deployed from 50 world areas in 2016 (including 253 long-term volunteers). Last year, 160 new missionaries were added.*

9,493 volunteers participated in missions in 2016. In addition to Global Serve, there were 285 short-term volunteers, and 9,208 Work & Witness team members.

People were treated at community-based clinics and health care centers all over the world with concentrated efforts in India, Papua New Guinea, and Swaziland.*

NMI and JESUS Film Harvest Partners collaborated through WEF, which helped provide infrastructure for 710 Nazarene JESUS Film teams to share God's love. In 2015–2016, the teams reported 3,338,852 evangelistic contacts. Of these contacts, 777,525 (23 percent of contacts) indicated decisions for Christ with 540,456 (70 percent of decisions) initial discipleship follow-ups. The teams started 8,756 preaching points in 2016.

NMI partnered with World Mission Broadcast (WMB), giving approximately US \$397,637 to provide radio, television, and Internet programs to share the gospel globally.

Nazarenes gave US \$2.46 million for Alabaster to fund construction projects in 2016. The Alabaster Offering is used in all six global regions. No Alabaster funds are used for administrative costs.

NMI partnered with Nazarene Compassionate Ministries to give more than US \$8.67 million for disaster response and compassion projects around the world and to support 11,819 children through Child Development Centers and Pastor's Kid programs. Churches sent 36,744 Crisis Care Kits and 7,200 School Pal-Paks.

NMI assisted Work & Witness in raising approximately US \$2.14 million (up 5.8 percent from FY 2015) to deploy 702 teams, an average of 13 teams per week. 9,208 people participated in Work & Witness in 2016, donating 357 years of labor.



DCPI Training

Are you interested in learning more about Church Planting or how your church might help in this process? Participants have three track options at this church planting training: Church Planting Essentials (CPE) or Churches Planting Churches (CPC) and there will be Certified Trainer (CT) training.

Church Planting Essentials is church planting "basic training." It is ideal for church plant pastors. The materials were created by Dynamic Church Planting International, based upon years of working in mission areas where the church is expanding rapidly. It is 3 full days, and teaches how to: Organize and refine your vision, purpose, strategies, and timeline early, so that you have a clear plan for the future; Use Biblical principles for church planting in everything you do; Recognize and avoid common church planting "land mines."

Churches Planting Churches is church sponsorship 101. It is ideal for pastors and church board members of sponsoring churches. It was also developed by Dynamic Church Planting International and lasts 3 days. The sessions in this training equip you to:

Answer fears and objections to church planting
Determine the involvement of the mother church
Find resources needed to fund the daughter church
Overcome common barriers in the new work
Recruit a church planter and leadership
Create your own personalized V.I.P. (Vision-Involvement-Plan)

In addition to these training tracks, there is Certified Trainer training that equips and certifies participants to reteach the materials in their local context. It is provided at no extra cost. Those wishing to be certified must attend a session before their track begins and another session when their track has finished. Certified Trainer training is identical for both tracks and need only be taken once.

Cost \$35 (Includes registration and three lunches; course materials provided free of charge.
