Jurisdictional General Superintendent

Dr. David W. Graves is a general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene.

Dr. Graves was chosen for the highest elected office in the denomination at the 27th General Assembly held in Orlando, Florida, USA, in 2009. At the time of his election, Dr. Graves was the senior pastor of College Church of the Nazarene in Olathe, Kansas, where he had served since 2006.

Prior to College Church, he served as director of Sunday School Ministries for the Church of the Nazarene International Headquarters from 2001 to 2006. He has had pastoral assignments in Kansas, Ohio, Tennessee, Oklahoma, and North Carolina. Graves is a graduate of Olivet Nazarene University and received his Master of Divinity degree from Nazarene Theological Seminary. He received an honorary Doctor of Divinity from Olivet. He is the author of three books and has written for numerous publications.

Dr. Graves and his wife, Sharon, have four married children, Michael, John, Stephen, and Rachel, and 12 beautiful grandchildren.

On July 26, 2016, at the 68th District Assembly, **Dr. Timothy W. Crump** was elected as the eighth District Superintendent of the Southwest Indiana District Church of the Nazarene. Pastor Tim received his Bachelors in Theology (1982) and a Masters of Arts in Religion (1985) from Olivet Nazarene University and has done additional upper-graduate work at Nazarene Theological Seminary. On May 9, 2020, he was conferred the Doctor of Divinity degree by Olivet Nazarene University.

Tim has pastored for 31 years. In September 2012 he accepted the call to be Lead Pastor at Salem First Church of the Nazarene, Salem, Oregon. Prior to his arrival in Salem, Tim led churches in Braidwood, Illinois, Okmulgee, Oklahoma, Lombard, Illinois, Kalamazoo, Michigan, and Decatur, Illinois.

His wife, Cindy, is a certified schoolteacher with a degree from Olivet in Elementary Education, and they are the proud parents of two adult children, Melanie Kwast (Jason) and Matthew Crump (Danielle), and three grandchildren.

We celebrate what the Lord has done in the life of our church this past year! We opened some new doors to ministry and had the blessing of seeing new lives come to Christ. We celebrate God bringing one of our mothers from near death, back to life after several weeks in the hospital. She can now testify to God's saving grace in her life, and we celebrated her baptism. Two others gave their hearts to Christ and were baptized this year as well. We began a new believers bible study as a result.

In the fall, we partnered with the Hope Resource Center, a pregnancy care center in Bedford, to become a satellite location for parenting classes, and a pantry site for baby supplies such as diapers, wipes and blankets that are used as part of the parenting classes as well as emergency assistance. This expanded the services provided by the center by creating a second location that increased access to surrounding communities. Several parents have graduated from the 10-week program, and many families have received supplies to care for their babies through this ministry.

At Christmas, we distributed 20 boxes of food for families in the community. Our sewing ladies also continue to support the local foster care support group by providing blankets, quilts, and pillows for foster children. We continue to rejoice in the ways that God gives us to reach our community.

We look forward to what God will continue to do through us in the coming year!

Our food pantry ministry successfully supplied food for six families before this pandemic and three more families during the pandemic. We were able to see three individuals come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. One of those was a remarkable story in itself. I was asked by a family member if I would visit a gentleman who was facing some very critical illnesses and was not receptive to have a minister visit. My response was that if he would allow me I would be more than happy to visit him. I prayed to the Lord that He would tender the heart of this gentleman. Two weeks after the request I received a call from the nephew of this gentleman and said I could come visit. Myself and the nephew went and visited with him for about two hours. I asked him many question to find out what his likes and great dislikes were. As it turned out we had many things in common and God had given me the scripture that says in John 14:13 "whatever we as in His name He will do...." We asked God to tender this mans heart and that's what he did! After a lot of conversation he opened up and said he wasn't familiar with God's word and the door was open. He did not accept the Lord at that visit but did invite me to come again. His illnesses became worse and he was admitted in a hospital. I visited him immediately and again shared God's word concerning the promise of the future but still no acceptance. I felt God's power each time and discerning His promise that whatever we ask He would provide. I did tell this gentleman that all he needed to do was call upon God's name and He would save him. He was released to the nursing home for rehab and I was there, and he said " preacher last night something strange happened I can't describe fully but I felt the presence of it must have been God and He said I need you and I said I want you too!" He said I can't explain how different I feel even though I'm not healed of my illnesses I feel great. I explained that was the answer to God's promise to provide a eternal home for the righteous and you now are part of the family of God! God's timing is remarkable, this gentleman passed away only 2 weeks later and now has an eternal healing. What a remarkable God we serve and the Orleans Church is so blessed to be a part of the call to " go into all the world and make disciples of all men teaching them to observe all things I have commanded." 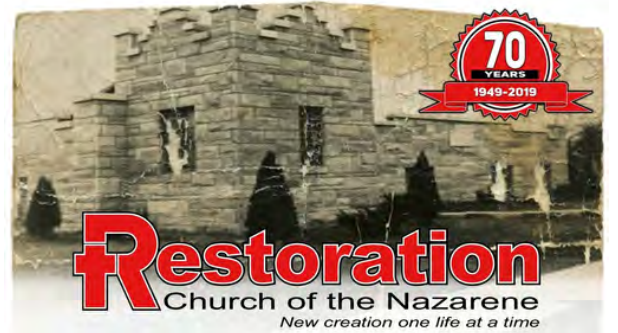

Restoration Church of the Nazarene 2019-2020 Report

I give God praise for the great people of Restoration Church and the exceptional leaders with missional hearts who have taken on new and unexpected challenges this year. A few highlights have included serving with two summer youth interns, Katie Suits and Seth Jones, and granting Seth his first local preacher's license in August. To better engage our college students with Christ and his church we instituted an Adopt-A-College-Student program offering regular care packages through the year and heavily subsidized a trip for ten students to Atlanta for the Passion Conference over the New Year. We have seen record numbers in our midweek student ministries and kids' programs and are grateful for a dedicated team of volunteers who show Christ's love to many each week. We have been able to serve our community in a variety of ways including another successful year of All Pro Dads in our neighboring elementary school and raising \$10,000 to bless our local Men's Warming Shelter.

The last few months have been the push we have needed to engage the church better through social media and begin offering weekly services online. We have seen multiple previously unchurched people begin to engage regularly through this new medium. With a grant from Center for Congregations we are excited to be able to continue this ministry and improve its quality.

I have been so proud of Pastor Mark Thompson, Pam Ritter and Tricia Tackett and their staff of volunteers who have upped their game to intentionally engage teens, children and their families while social distancing. Our childcare has been fortunate to stay open through the pandemic and has even reached additional families because of a temporary partnership to provide care for employees of IU Health. We are excited to see what is next.

May God increase our reach into our community and the world with the life changing story of redemption and restoration.

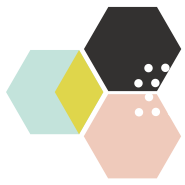

2019-2020

Greetings co-laborers in Christ,

Our first official Sunday at Valley Mission was November 3, 2019. We started at a fast pace and enjoyed early momentum. We were able to quickly add to our attendance, saw increases in giving, updated our membership list, modernized our office technology and added some important ministry infrastructure that would help us attain long term ministry goals.

And then....just like all of you we faced one of the most unique challenges we have ever seen in the church, a global pandemic. When we arrived we were doing life as a church like many of you. We offered Sunday morning worship and livestream on Facebook. We offered Sunday evening Life Groups and Wednesday evening Bible study. Children's programs were doing well and we had just begun to restart our youth program with 8 teens attending. And then....

What do you do when the systems and plans are no longer allowed to continue? What will happen if there are no actual people inside the church building? How will you spread the gospel to as many as we can, as often as we can? Will people continue to give, and is it even right to ask them to be faithful with such uncertainty in the world? Will we be able to pay our monthly mortgage? All of the questions racing through our minds with very little answers can often lead to making decisions based on fear. Early in the process we took steps to apply for payment protection as well as only paying interest on our loan. We soon abandoned those options as we took the posture of responding instead of retreating.

Our continuing COVID-19 ministry may not be for everyone, but it is for us. We started out with the belief that if our people would gather together in the future, the example must be set in the present. Our approach was to minister to all of the people regardless of their personal opinions or fears.

- We were live at the same time and place as always, in our gathering place, the church.
- We produced DVDs of worship for our seniors who did not have internet.
- We offered an evening drive-in service for the vulnerable in our congregation.
- We offered a Wednesday devotional through our Facebook page and our website.
- We added a Youtube channel accessible from our webpage.
- We encouraged board contact to our entire congregation.
- We sent out weekly letters to keep communication open and everyone on the same page.
- Our church children sent crafts to our seniors in the hopes of offering encouragement and love during a stressful time.

As time passed, we revised our plan to encourage a slow return to the church building:

- We stream lined our morning worship by offering in-person, live stream and drive-in service at our 10:00 am start time.
- We moved our Wednesday online devotional to an outdoor pavilion at the church and opened it to in-person fellowship and music.

Each step was a process and inside of guidelines in order to slowly but surely welcome our people back.

The results have been as good as could be expected under the circumstances. Our finances have been remarkable. We have added a new couple and have even added a regular attendee from another state who tithes and watches via Facebook.

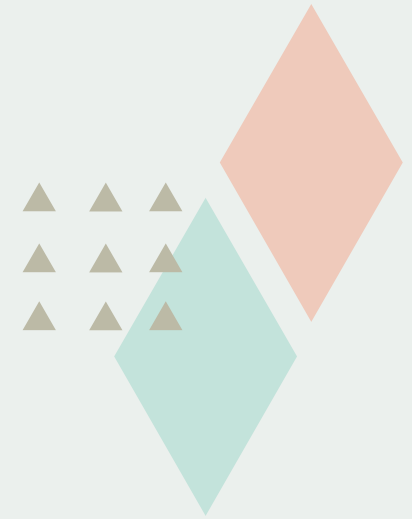
Are we where we want to be? No! However, we are slowly, safely, and confidently moving forward and believe God has great days ahead!

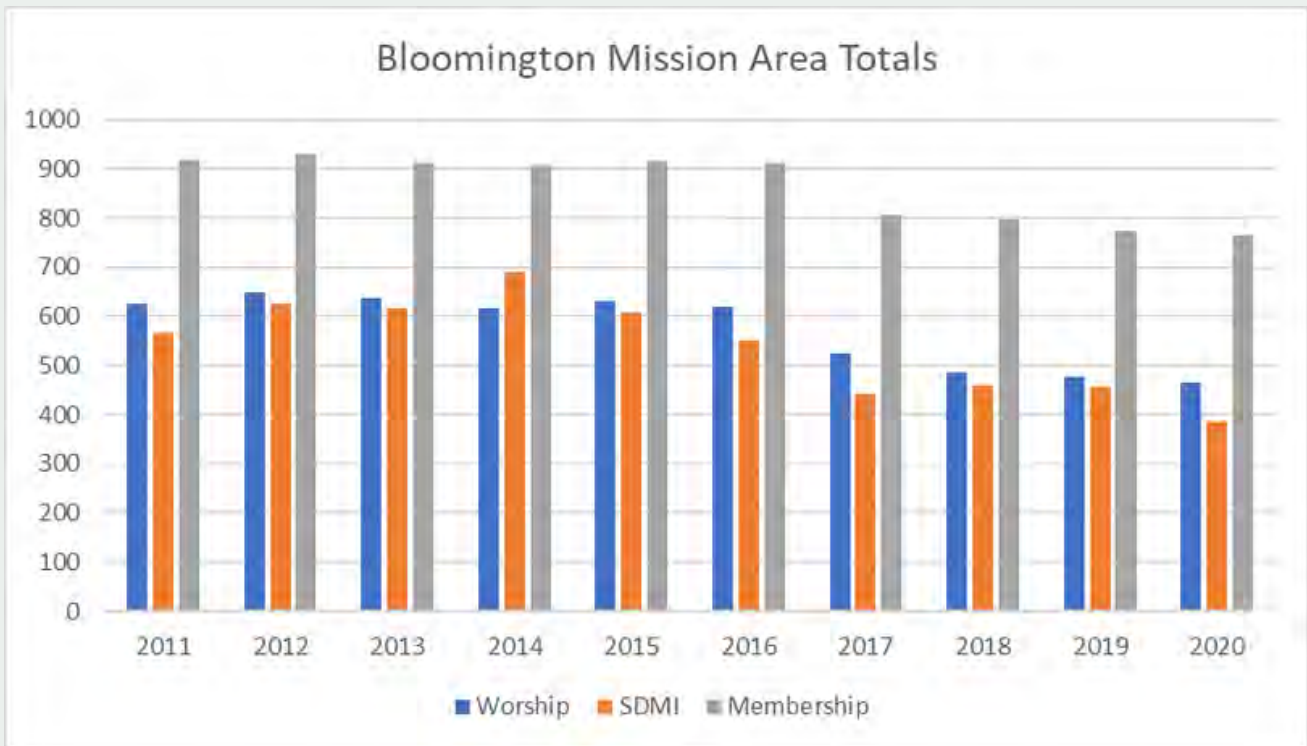

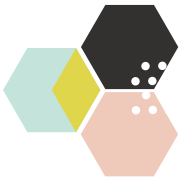

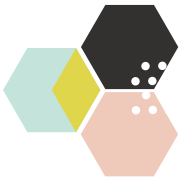

We respectfully submit that goals achieved by the small church are done by the empowerment of Christ Himself, and for this we are grateful.



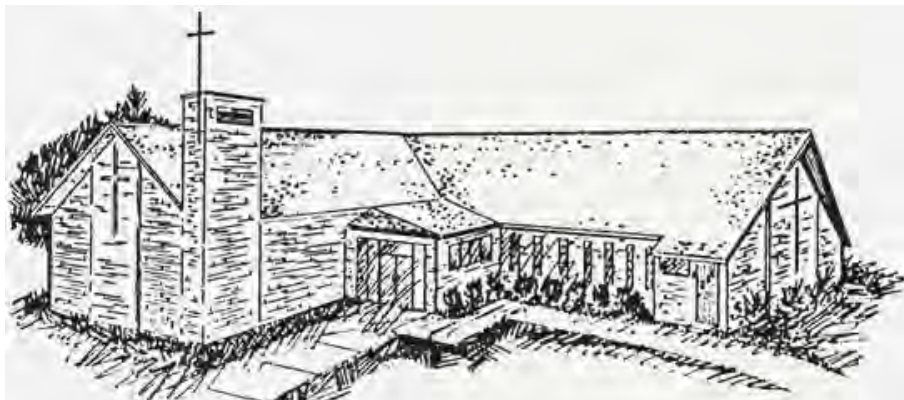

- **Family Focused:** On November 24 we held a baptismal service in our church facility for the first time, thanks to the purchase of our new portable baptistry.

Point Township Church of the Nazarene and our PAC, Beyond the Walls Ministry, is comprised of a group of wonderful believers that love the Lord. Like many other communities in our nation, there is a desperate need for light. A recently retired trial court judge in our community is moved to tears every time he and I speak about the church. He says, "Point Township will never know how much our community has been affected by what the church has done for our community." The light of Jesus shines through this community of believers, we do not go to church - we are the church.

"Feeding Our Future" was born in April 2019. We believe the Holy Spirit exposed a need in our community. May of 2019 Point Township church called a community meeting and invited the them to join us as we began offering a free lunch Monday through Friday to school age kids that depended on "free lunch" offered by the school district. During the summer of 2019 over 7800 lunches were passed out or delivered. At this time "Feeding Our Future" is on track to deliver over 13,000 lunches. The church and the community have joined together and are passing out more than food. We are offering hope that can only be found in Jesus Christ. To further connect with our community we host a block party at the Beyond the Walls campus which allows us to register kids for our children's ministry and it gives a chance to meet their parents.

When the state government began to limit physical meetings, Point developed a Facebook page that was invite only. This allowed the congregation to invite people to go to their church without ever leaving their home. There are over 700 members on that page and weekly conversations are had with people that are looking for hope in this broken world.

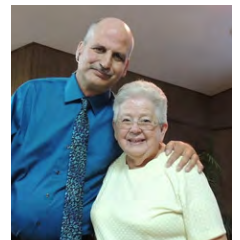

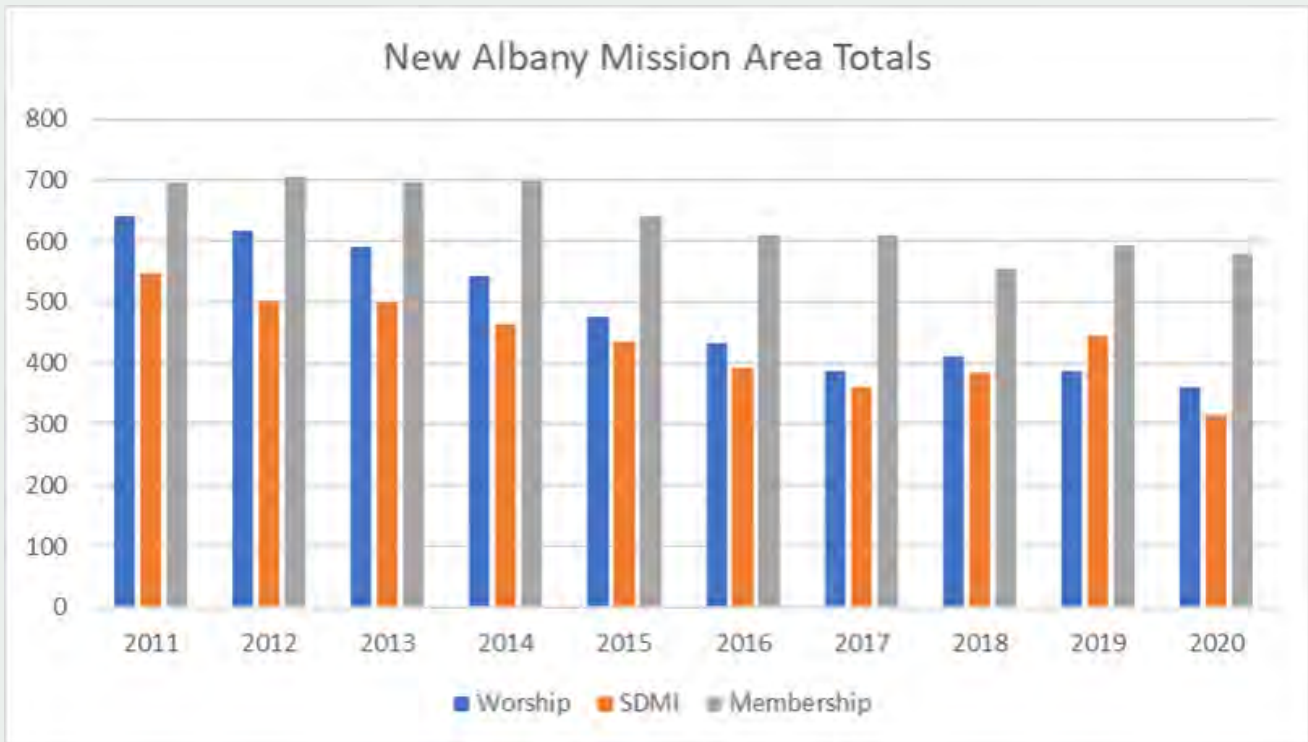

Greetings Dr. Graves, Dr. Crump, delegates and friends of SWID District Assembly 2020,

We, as a Church board, continue to try to think outside the box. We had two Christian movies we were able to show outside on a large 9'x16' screen. We had to cancel a movie because of the pandemic.

In September, we baptized eight people in a creek that belongs to a fellow church in the country. (Their church people actually helped out with music as well as helping our people in and out of the water.) It started out with five people and the group kept growing. Praise the Lord!

Every year we participate in a community effort "Feed the Hungry". We helped out both monetarily and physically.

When the pandemic hit, we started to do "Drive-in Worship" with an FM transmitter. We start each service with a song by Adams Voice - "Come Sit on the Porch" since I am out on the "porch of the church. Closing each service we use another song by Adams Voice, "The Church Has Left the Building." We started with a small transmitter that would only reach out in the parking lot about 50 – 75 feet. After two weeks, we purchased a transmitter (which does not require an FCC license) that would reach 300 feet. We have had several repeat visitors to come and worship with us during this time.

On Easter, we were able to serve communion safely to 50 people who sat in their cars listening and participating in the service. We will be able to use the transmitter when we do our outdoor movies. We have been putting the weekly message on Facebook. We have also been making a weekly DVD for an older adult that does not have internet.

As the weather has warmed up, we have continued to see an influx of people playing on our property, basketball, walking, running, riding their bicycles, walking their dogs, etc.

Through this whole pandemic, the church has learned that the building is essential, but we do not need the building, we need JESUS and each other! As things return to a "new" normal, may we continue to look at what God has given us and use us in unique ways! I look forward to being able to make "touches" in our community!

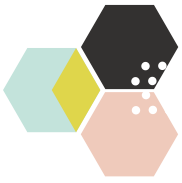

Like many of our fellowships will report, this year has been challenging. Yet, in the challenge there has been things to celebrate.

We launched small groups in January. We spent much time educating ourselves, then developing a strategy, setting out goals and objectives for small group ministry in our fellowship. We trained and informed those who were interested as well as established curriculum to be followed. Our hope was to launch three to five groups that would lead the way. The groups would involve ten or less people. The result was nine groups launched and over 100 people participated. Unity among the fellowship resulted. Morale increased as did attendance numbers and participation in the church in general. With the pandemic we were concerned what would happen with the groups and the momentum gained. They kept meeting, via technology and creative social distancing.

Shutting down services was difficult as momentum had arrived within our fellowship. But with our Refocus effort a few years ago we put in place ways to reach outside the church through technology. This proved essential to our continued ministry. Our viewership increased dramatically and giving during the shutdown actually increased. Since reopening services in a limited way viewership has declined, as expected, but is still above previous levels. We have connected with people who are not a part of any fellowship. For this we are grateful.

I would add in closing that the staff has been incredible during these trying times. Our fellowship has been grateful for their work, supportive of our ministry and encouraging in their notes and in voice.

- We averaged over 100 senior adults for our Prime-Time monthly meal and devotion.
- Our Wednesday night youth group has grown from an average of 2 teens to an average of 14 teens!
- We baptized 14 people and welcomed 7 people into church membership!
- We effectively began posting our services online and will soon begin live-streaming on Sunday mornings!

This past year we have witnessed God working through our members to impact our community and we believe that greater days are ahead. We are excited to see how God continues to use Parkview to LOVE BIG in our community and around the world!

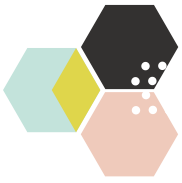

Unfortunately, most people have no problem telling you what the Church is against. This past year we have been letting them know what we are for. Through a four-week series called FOR Seymour, we were able to let them know that we are for people of all ages (children, youth, and adults), we are for our community, schools, and businesses. Once they realize that we are for them, we believe it will be a shorter step for them to understand that God is for them too. This series had several interactive elements that allowed for individual and corporate community impact.

A highlight of the FOR Seymour series was a special offering where we raised over \$52K to erase \$6½ million of unpaid medical debt for 2,900 families in and around Seymour (including Jackson, Jennings, and part of Bartholomew county). Overall, our "Giving to Others" has continued to increase to record levels this year through ministries like SWID, the World Evangelism fund, clean water projects, and child sponsorship.

COVID-19 created some unusual challenges but also some amazing opportunities this year. We have now prioritized online ministry, realizing that a large portion of our congregation is engaging significantly, and some solely, through our online services. God has enabled us to extend the reach of our ministry, far beyond what we would have ever expected or imagined prior to this year. We are learning to strategically engage people of all ages as they pursue their path to spiritual growth and personal involvement here at The Point.

I am thankful for a leadership team who is willing to do whatever it takes to adapt to current conditions as we continue to proclaim the lifechanging message of the gospel. We are making plans to reach more people this year than we ever have before.

As you can see, we have had another great year of ministry here at The Point. Our focus remains beyond the four walls as we continue our mission is to Point more and more people to Jesus. God gets all the glory for the great things He has done!

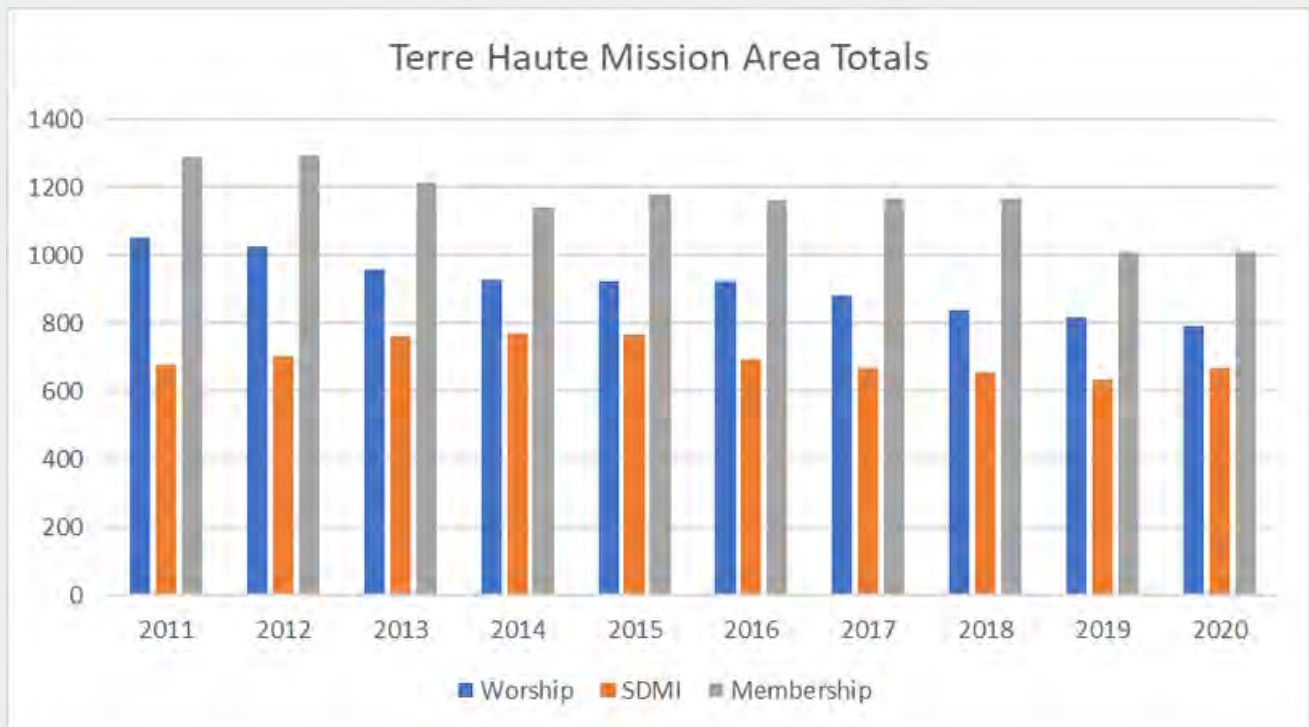

We continued our partnerships with Youth for Christ, East Side Elementary, and the Crisis Pregnancy Center. We also continued our Sunday morning breakfast, and Wednesday evening teen meal.

A new ministry for me as pastor was a personal involvement in Club 345. Club 345 was started by First Methodist in Brazil as a ministry to the elementary school near their church. This year they partnered with us to start a club with the school next to our church. Club 345 is an after-school program for 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders that meets once each week for home-work help, character building, and life skills. I really enjoyed getting to know some of the children from the school. A few of the children that attended Club 345 already come to our church, so I was able to get to know them better. DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Timothy W. Crump, District Superintendent

Looking Back

Who would have ever imagined all God would do through the faithful people who comprise the Southwest Indiana District during this past year?

Several months ago, SWID was ready and raring to move forward for the glory of God! Summer camps, NYC, building projects, vacation bible schools, revivals, and the launching of many missional endeavors were taking place all across the district.

In July 2019, we gathered in Evansville for our NYI & NMI Conventions and our District Assembly. What an inspiring and exciting time! A number of our churches were experiencing substantial growth in worship and discipleship opportunities as we progressed into the fall. We held our annual Pastors & Mates Retreat in Louisville, Kentucky. Our Children & Youth Bible Quizzing programs were placing the Word of God deep in the heart of our young people. Our District NYI leadership hosted an amazing Youth Lock-In, and in December, our pastors and staff, along with their families, gathered at Valley Mission for a Christmas luncheon.

As we entered 2020, we began to hear news about a virus, Covid-19, which was starting to impact people in a place so seemingly far away, China. Little did we realize in a matter of a few weeks, this virus would begin to affect our country, state, local communities, and churches. Today, the virus circles the globe and impacts our entire world and way of life. Nevertheless, the ministries and mission of the Church of the Nazarene are alive and well as our 2.6 million members who comprise our 30,875 churches continue to Make Christlike Disciples in the Nations!

Fortunately, pastors and churches across our district began to see the need for the latest technology to both remain connected and to proclaim the Word of God while remaining socially distanced. In a matter of a few days, Facebook pages and websites were re-designed, churches were offering online giving and streaming worship services and conducting meetings through Zoom. Many of our churches received technology grants up to \$5,000 that helped in this time of transition. "Blessing Boxes" were built and stocked to provide food and supplies for those in need. Even pastoral care increased amid social distancing as churches thought of creative and yet impactful ways of expressing love and support. I am grateful to report that the Southwest Indiana District rose to the challenge of these unique days and continued fulfilling its mission of Making Christlike Disciples in the Nations.

When we could not meet in our church facilities, several pastors began offering drive-in services with an FM transmitter. Rev. Robert Muncie, along with his wife, Jane, was the first to implement this method of worship, and before long, a number of our churches followed suit. A few of our rural pastors realized that many of their people did not have internet availability and would be unable to join them if they offered services on Facebook Live. So, they prepared a weekly written sermon manuscript along with prayer requests and discipleship materials. One such pastor, Matt Roberts, who serves our Haleysburg Church, regularly drove 100 miles each weekend to personally deliver the good news to his people and community.

These past months have encouraged me as I realize so much more is possible in and through our district and our godly and faithful pastors. While we still face challenges, our churches and pastors continue to implement creative ways to worship God and share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Today, while churches are open, many of our people have yet to return. Thankfully, we continue to provide a variety of ways people can gather for the worship and praise of God

In these ever-changing days, we implemented a Zoom Board of Ministry Meeting, where we interviewed twenty-five ministerial candidates over video-conferencing. As a result, we have recommended three candidates (Rev. Aaron Gall, Rev. Todd Gotshall, and Rev. Travis Stamper) to the District Advisory Committee for approval to be ordained in a service on Sunday, August 9, at Columbus First. Also, the District Nominating Committee met through Zoom video conferencing, and with the assistance of Philip (PJ) Doerner, we enabled our district to elect leaders on July 16th-17th using Election Runner.

This year we recognize the retirement of four elders from our district. We are thankful for the faithful ministry of Rev. William (Norma) Covey, Rev. Troy (Angie) DeKemper, Dr. James (Marilyn) Hicks, and Rev. Robert (Jane) Muncie. We are grateful for the 153 years of faithful ministerial service these retirees have given on behalf of the Church of the Nazarene.

Last fall, we also launched SWID's School of Ministry under the leadership of Rev. Dale Stoops. We are currently offering our third class and look forward to assisting men and women from across the district as they prepare for ministry in response to the call of God upon their lives.

This spring, we launched our first Ministerial Candidate Workshop at the Higher Ground Retreat Center in West Harrison, Indiana. This two-day event was created to further train and equip those called into ministry. Approximately 40 people gathered for this special weekend. A special thanks to Rev. Ken Bushey, Rev. & Mrs. Jason Riggle, Rev. Pat Shay, Dr. & Mrs. Garry Pate, and my wife, Cindy, for their instruction and leadership.

Our Mission Areas conducted workdays at Dana, Vincennes First & Evansville Beacon, where we have relaunched our Haitian ministry with the assistance of Pastor Cathy West, and the people of Evansville Faith.

God blessed our Youth & Children's camps in July as young people from across the district experienced salvation and took significant strides as disciples of Jesus.

We offered many training opportunities as Dr. Phil Fuller, District Superintendent of the Virginia District, was our featured speaker at our district-wide EQUIP in October. In addition, we offered a new pastor orientation and several zoom meetings with pastors and denominational leaders such as Dr. David Graves and Dr. Robert Broadbooks in early 2020.

This year our District SDMI, under the leadership of Dr. James Hicks, sponsored an evening with Dr. Les and Leslie Parrot entitled: "Fight Night!" This event designed to help married couples was simulcast at several locations across the district and serves as an example of how SDMI and the district look to serve our local congregations in the future.

Expressing Thanks

I want to express my sincere appreciation for Dr. David Graves, our jurisdictional General Superintendent, who, throughout this year, has provided godly wisdom, timely guidance, and encouragement for the future throughout the year.

This year we saw the sale of our District office building (amid Covid-19) located at 3827 Austin Drive in Bedford, Indiana. However, the District Office is alive and well as it is not brick and mortar, but instead people who are giving themselves to serve the people of the Southwest Indiana District and our wonderful Lord. I want to thank our District Treasurer, Gary Ritter, for his continued excellent work and ministry both for our local congregations and the district at large. Rev. Matt Gargiulo, our District Operations & Technology Administrator, has faithfully and effectively performed his duties as he serves the Lord and our district. Rev. Pat Shay, our new District Secretary, has completed his tasks as though he has been doing this job for years. Together we form your district office and are here to serve.

I want to acknowledge the outstanding leadership provided by Rev. Mark Thompson, our District Nazarene Youth International President, Christy Boes Eubanks, our District Nazarene Missions International President, and Dr. James Hicks, our District Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries International chairperson. At this time, Dr. Hicks is retiring as our District SDMI Chairperson after having served in this capacity for many years. I want to thank Dr. Hicks for his strong emphasis on discipleship and small groups and for his wise and faithful leadership.

The District Advisory Board comprised of Rev. Ken Bushey, Rev. Jane Muncie, Rev. Darin Nossett, Rev. Andrew Johnson, Tim Scott, Doug Jones, Bruce Marshall, and Philip (PJ) Doerner has been especially busy this year. Words cannot even begin to express my appreciation for their guidance and due diligence with so many challenging and yet important matters which we dealt with this year.

A special thank you goes to our Mission Area Directors: Dr. Todd Stepp, Rev. Jonathan Scott, Rev. Todd Gotshall, Rev. Steve Beck, Rev. Ben Muncie, Rev. Mark Roberts, Rev. Joel Parsons, and Rev. Tim Lichtley for their assistance and leadership across the district.

The Compassion & Hope House has been distributing needed food and supplies monthly and is preparing to launch a Celebrate Recovery ministry. Special thanks to Treva Lukens, our director, and the excellent board that leads our compassionate ministry center in Newberry.

I am grateful to God for my family, for Cindy's love and constant support and for the blessings God has bestowed upon us. In January of this year, I had surgery for a detached retina, and Cindy helped with the driving as I recovered. Thankfully following a recent cataract surgery, the sight in my eye is significantly improving. I am so thankful for your prayers and a healing touch from God!

Accountability

This year, I have preached, encouraged pastors and churches, and led or was a part of 79 church board meetings. I conducted nine pastoral reviews and installed seven pastors. Once the virus started impacting SWID, I conducted weekly Zoom services and Facebook Live preaching and established a Youtube channel for churches without a pastor or whose pastor was technologically challenged. I want to express my gratitude to Rev. Nathan Rogers, who provided recorded worship for the Zoom services I held when we were unable to meet in our churches. I am continuing to preach weekly using Facebook Live and then travel to a church on the district.

A total of fifty-seven churches have paid all allocations in full. Five hundred and fifty-three people were saved through the ministry of the churches on our district. Sadly, twenty of our churches reported no conversions through their ministry. I would ask these pastors and churches to make evangelism a high priority. We obviously can do better even in the season we find ourselves in today. We baptized 247 people and welcomed 183 New Nazarenes.

We averaged 5,807 people in our weekly worship services. This was a decrease of 43 people and reflects not having services March-May which are typically some of our strongest months of attendance. The income of our churches this year was \$9,762,891. Our churches contributed \$500,759 to the World Evangelism Fund, \$239,917 to Missional Specials, \$182,918 to Pensions & Benefits, and \$449,799 to SWID, and \$174,758 to Olivet Nazarene University. This year the District Advisory Board voted to fully fund our financial commitment to Olivet Nazarene University by sending \$26,689 from the district funds bringing the total given for Olivet to \$201,350. As a district we believe we are better together!

SDMI CHAIRMAN REPORT

Dr. James R. Hicks, Chairman

Dr. Graves, Dr. Crump, and Assembly delegation,

I bring to you my tenth and final report as your District SDMI Chair. It has been a rewarding ten years, and I look forward to what lies ahead under new leadership. I know God has great things ahead for SWID SDMI.

As we look back to this past year, it has been an unusual and interesting year. The Coronavirus that hit during the year not only affected our churches, but also the ministries of our District SDMI. Our annual District Ladies' Day in April 2020 and the District Prime Time banquets in April & May 2020 had to be cancelled. The Children's Camp, and our Family Fun Day at Holiday World in June had to be cancelled. With all of these cancellations, our kids, teens, and adults took it all in stride. I want to thank each and every one for their willingness to see that safety was more important than meeting together for these endeavors.

Ten years ago, I said that the business of SDMI is more than training the mind. SDMI includes transforming the heart. This means we are more than programs and events such as Sunday School, Small Groups, Kids' Camp, Ladies' Day, Men's Breakout, and more. Ultimately, we are about application of truth so that people's minds are more than informed; their lives are transformed.

Secondly, the business of SDMI is to discover new ways that will reach people for Christ. New ways always include being open to the Holy Spirit as He teaches us and a willingness to include new people He brings into our lives. As leaders, training new SDMI leaders and watching them succeed becomes a payday of personal satisfaction.

A third aspect of the business of SDMI is to emphasize accountability concerning discipleship. We must constantly be aware it is possible to have church programs such as Sunday School and Small Groups and still fall short of being about the Master's business of making disciples. Each church needs to track who in the church is actually discipling someone else, as well as tracking if individual classes and ministries are being effective in discipling individuals. SDMI is not just about telling a story or teaching a class; it is involving, discipling, and mentoring our students and those under our influence so they can learn. Whether a Sunday School teacher or Small Group leader, we must as Saint Gregory of Nyssa described, chew on our lessons so they will appear mouth-watering to those in our classes (paraphrased), and then involve others in the practice of what we are teaching.

I want to personally thank those who have so faithfully labored this year in the area of SDMI. We have a great SDMI Board and they exhibit a real passion in the areas of Sunday School and Small Groups. The District SDMI Board consists of: Dr. Timothy Crump, Bethany Burnett, Rev. Joshua Caplinger, Alissa DeKemper, Rev. Andrew Johnson, Dede Jones, Rev. Doug Lane, Rev. Jonathan Scott, Christina Shay, and Rev. Dale Stoops. Christy Eubanks and Rev. Mark Thompson serve as ex-officio members. The commitment, advice, and encouragement from each of these is truly appreciated.

Throughout the year, SDMI has ministered to all age groups across our District. Rev. Doug Lane has done an outstanding job as the District Adult Ministries Director and has been assisted by Tom Bush as Prime Time Director, Rachel Roll as Women's Director, and Rev. Mark Roberts as Men's Director. Rev. Dale Stoops served as our Children's Ministries Director and has been assisted by McKenzie Woolsey as our Children's Quizzing Director, and Tom McCool as our Kids' Camp Director. Thanks to all of these for a job well done. You will be blessed for the lives you have touched.

Something new our District SDMI initiated this year was showing a simulcast entitled "Fight Night." This was a Valentine event to strengthen marriages specifically and relationships in general. The virtual meeting was held at the same time in five different locations across our District. The leadership team made up of Rev. Doug Lane, Steve Boggs, Rev. Marlin Betts, Rev. Jonathan Scott, and myself worked out the details as 480 participated from across our District. Praise be to God!

With the Pandemic occurring in March 2020, we discontinued counting our Sunday School and Discipleship groups for the remainder of the church year. In calculating for only nine months, we had a decrease of 351 from last year in our Sunday School attendance. However, we had an increase of 600 in our Discipleship Groups. Meeting in Small Groups at a variety of times during the week continues to be very appealing to a growing number of our churches. Our overall SDMI attendance for the year was 4,913. As we move forward into the new year, let us continue being persistent in reaching out to those within and outside of our church.

Ultimately, the success of both Sunday School and Small Groups rely on the movement of the Holy Spirit. However, we must remember that we are truly the special tools to be used toward that success. Since the beginning of the Sunday School movement in Britain in the 1700s, and the small group movement of Jesus with His own disciples, both have proven to be successful when implemented within God's purpose. Willie Robertson on the TV program Duck Dynasty once said that "we tend to hold on to things - to hold on to memories." The philosophical Willie then added, "we have to let go of things to have room for new memories." Let us, as a District, truly realize our greatest memories have not yet occurred. As we move from where we are and venture into His new presence, our Sunday Schools and Small Groups will be transformed into true joys and rich, fun experiences.

Winston Churchill once said, "the farther backward you can look, the farther forward you are likely to see." This is true spiritually as we understand the New Testament better by looking into the Old Testament. It is also a true statement concerning relationships. We can look back over our lives and see how we have needed others in the past and still need them today. From the cradle to the time we enter our graves, we need relationships with other people.

We were never intended to mature spiritually, serve, or worship God as isolated Christians. People who are not part of a small group can begin to feel alone and void of a spiritual community. Individual quiet times are necessary as the Scripture admonishes us to “be still and know that I am God” (Psalm 46:10). However, Paul is insistent that we also need to grow spiritually by being connected to others. In fact, the head of the Church, Christ, is connected to the church body and not just isolated individuals. Colossians 2:19 reads, “the Head, from whom the whole body, supported and held together by its ligaments and sinews, grows as God causes it to grow.”

On a final note, let me say that SDMI is very dear to my heart. I have thoroughly enjoyed being on the District SDMI Board for these thirty-two years, ten of those as District SDMI Chair. Also, for the past several years, I have enjoyed serving on our USA/Canada SDMI task force to research new ways to make SDMI more effective. This has included me having the privilege of serving as the Educational Field Coordinator for the Central USA Region for SDMI. It has truly been my joy to serve alongside eight other Field Coordinators in challenging and encouraging other SDMI Chairs at their District levels.

Mentoring and coaching others has been a passion of mine. I love the one-on-one teaching in a small group. Watching someone leave his/her comfort zone or stretching to new heights spiritually is very rewarding. Don't take your groups for granted. Don't forget you are their spiritual leader. Each person looks to you for spiritual leadership. Keep your heart open to God's leading. Lean on Him as you teach and facilitate. You may have those times that you would like to quit because you wonder if what you are saying is sinking in. Your students may not tell you they learned something every week; however, bathe in those times that they do tell you. It will encourage you to keep going. I believe if you really enjoy doing something, you will not burn out. You may get tired or discouraged but, in those times, you can rely on your call and look higher than yourself to the One who will refill you and re-energize you for the days ahead.

My prayer for you this coming year is simply this: “May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit” (Romans 15:13).

Continue teaching! Continue coaching! Continue facilitating! Continue making Christlike disciples wherever you serve! You will reap a great harvest if you don't give up!

NMI PRESIDENT REPORT

I bring to you my third report as SWID NMI President. Wow! What a year! This year is so different in some many ways. Today, I should be standing in front of a great group of Nazarenes from Southwest Indiana. Instead, people all across SWID are reading this from their homes. I so wish I could be sharing this in person. I miss being together physically as a SWID NMI body.

But know what? God is still the same rather we meet in person or if we just read this report from our homes! God has not changed and our work to further His Kingdom has not changed. Now more than ever the people of Southwest Indiana must continue to be a LIGHT for Him during these very dark times. Acts 13:47 states, "For so the Lord has commanded us, 'I HAVE PLACED YOU AS A LIGHT FOR THE GENTILES, THAT YOU MAY BRING SALVATION TO THE END OF THE EARTH.'"

NMI remains the same. We are still ONE PEOPLE! Our purpose remains to mobilize the Church of the Nazarene in missions through: PRAYING, GIVING, EDUCATING, and ENGAGING CHILDREN AND YOUTH."

The Nazarene Church now ministers in 163 world areas. In February of 2020, the General Board approved official entrance into the following world area: Africa Region—Central African Republic. Praise God! In 2019, there were 586 missionaries from 67 world areas. Of this, 360 are global deployed and 226 are sponsored deployed. Last year alone, 86 new missionaries were added. Within these missionary families, there are 312 missionary kids. Isn't it exciting that SWID is one tiny part of the body that makes-up the Church of the Nazarene Worldwide.

I am proud to say that SWID NMI is alive and well even in the midst of a national pandemic. We are still praying, giving, educating, and engaging children and youth! This wouldn't be possible without the wonderful District NMI Council members that shine their lights brightly across SWID. I am so grateful for these council members:

Lillian Pursell, Renee Johnson, Marilyn Hicks, Debbie Betts, Jarren Rogers, Michael Elliott, Lydia Elliott, Marci Lichtley, Beth Brown, Sarah Ross, Shelia Thompson, Sonya Nixon Gotshall, Doug Jones, Ken Walker, Dave Lynn, Janet Ritter, Ron Ritter, Ashley Diaz, Carrie Burris, Bethany Burnett, and Treva Lukens.

Thank you for your countless hours of serving God through missions and letting your light shine brightly wherever you are.

Matthew 5:14-16 says, “You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.” All ages on SWID, are crucial to “Lighting Our World” right here in Southwest Indiana as well as globally. Each of us has a light, HIS light to shine brightly!

At the end of the District NMI Convention last year, I gave the following challenge for SWID NMI: “Who will take your candle and go light your world? Remember even the smallest light can make a difference in the darkest night. Charles Spurgeon said, “The Bible is not the light of the world, it is the light of the Church. But the world does not read the Bible, the world reads Christians! You are the light of the world.” Will we be the Light in our world that helps others see? I challenged SWID to “hold out our candles for all to see them”. May we not shine our own light but may we always reflect and shine His light.”

Our prayer for Southwest Indiana for this past church year was “Jesus, Lord of our salvation, Savior of our souls. Jesus, King of every nation, this world’s only hope, send us out to the world to make you known.” May We “Go Light Our World”. I know our prayer was heard this past year as we look back and see all that was accomplished for advancing the Kingdom of God through SWID NMI.

NMI has 5 Top Areas of Impact. These areas are World Evangelism Fund (WEF), Alabaster Offering, Links, Prayer, and Engage Children and Youth. Let’s see our God used SWID to impact “our mission fields” through these areas of impact.

1 **World Evangelism Fund (WEF)** is the key to the fulfillment of our mission. The purpose of WEF is to sustain valuable ministries through consistent mission funding. WEF fuels the Church of the Nazarene’s mission. The WEF goal for SWID was \$498,210.58! SWID gave **\$500,395.89! Our WEF is PAID IN FULL!** This is over \$23,000 more than was given last year. All but one church participated in giving to the World Evangelism Fund. That means seventy-four churches gave to WEF. In fact, sixty churches gave 100% or more to WEF! How amazing is that even during this time of COVID-19! God is good! SWID is a beacon of light during these dark days.

We have thirty-four churches that have received the **Church of Excellence Award** because of their giving to WEF. To do this, the church paid at least 5.7% or greater of their income for WEF. The churches receiving Church of Excellence are:

Bloomington Eastview, Bloomington First, Brazil, Brownstown, Cayuga, Columbus First, Dale, Evansville Faith, Evansville Grace, Faith Community, Francisco, Freedom, Freetown, Georgetown, Grandview, Greencastle, Harmony Chapel, House of Faith (Carbon), Jasper, Mackey, Newburgh New Life, Oakland City, Odon, Point Township, Restoration, Rockport, Shoals, Spencer, Springs Valley, St. Bernice, Sullivan, Union Chapel, Valley Mission, and Zion Community!

Thank you churches for being faithful in giving this past year! We cannot out give God.

2 All contributions to **Alabaster** are used to construct churches, clinics, schools, parsonages, district centers, and to purchase land. No funds are used for administrative costs. **SWID gave \$40,388.40 this year.** This is an increase of over \$3,000 from last year. Thank you for giving to this important work. Remember, there is no specific goal for Alabaster. Alabaster Offering is usually in September and February. However, monies can be received throughout the year.

3 **LINKS** strategically connects Nazarene missionaries and Nazarene churches through prayer, personal contact, and generous giving. This gives each church an opportunity to become personally connected with a missionary family and their field of service. We ask that each church participate not only in prayer but by giving to their links family. This is a personal gift that goes straight to the missionaries and can be used for whatever needs they may have. Our Links missionaries need us. We are their extended family.

The SWID Links Missionaries through 2022 are Carol Rittenhouse from Costa Rica and Stephane & Sandra Tibi from Germany-Switzerland. Please remember your Link families throughout the year and above all please pray for them.

4 **Prayer** is the fourth area of impact. Prayer is the lifeblood of all that we do. Through prayer, we are connected to our brothers and sisters in Christ across the globe. Let us never forget to pray for our missionary families, our churches, and all of those around us. We do not know what our missionaries are facing daily. Pray for their protection and that God will use them in a might way. Pray for guidance, wisdom, and strength. Pray for peace and comfort as they are away from their families. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (ESV) says, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

5 The last area of impact is **Engage Children and Youth**. NMI encourages all churches to involve children and youth in all mission endeavors and to nurture them as they seek to respond to HIS call.

All churches are encouraged to include all ages, including children and youth in missions. We must engage them, empower them, equip them, expose them, encourage them, and excite them as it relates to missions. God is still calling children and youth into fulltime ministry of serving him through missions. As a district, we must help nurture that call. We must be intentional and encourage and engage every child and teen in the mission of God in our local communities and around the world.

SWID was able to engage our children and youth for missions this past year. Children from fifteen SWID churches got involved with giving to missions through the VBS offering. Our SWID children gave \$4,111.17 to Kids of the Word Kids Reaching Kids mission offering project. During Children's Camp last June 2019, our children were able to enjoy learning from our Missionary in Residence at Camp. Our very own Sarah Ross was able to spend the week with the children teaching them many aspects of what is like to be a missionary.

This year's theme for the children's offering is Discipling the Disciples of Children. As with God's discipling of Moses, the proper discipling of children's leaders and workers is essential to the fulfillment of God's mission for all children, everywhere. Through your giving, the Kids Reaching Kids offering will provide the disciples of children with the needed resources to fulfill God's mission in their church and communities.

During SWID teen camp last summer, the teens spent time doing service projects around the campground and in the Cincinnati area. They were also able to attend workshops that highlighted ways to answer the call, to serve Jesus, and to be a light wherever they are. Unfortunately, our Teen C.A.R.E Corps trip to Trinidad had to be canceled this year due to the pandemic. It is our hope that we will be able to schedule another trip soon so our teens have the opportunity to participate in life changing trip. I am grateful for the partnership that SWID NMI has with SDMI and NYI as we work together to provide opportunities for our children and youth.

In order to be a **Missions Priority One Church**, a church must participate in all 5 Areas of Impact. We have 54 churches to recognize as a Missions Priority One Church. This is an increase from last year! Thank you for praying, teaching, giving of your time, involving children and youth, supporting WEF by meeting your 5.5% goal, participating in Alabaster, and remembering your Links. Missions Priority One churches are:

Bloomington Eastview, Bloomington First, Booneville, Brazil, Brownstown, Cayuga, Chandler, Columbus First, Community of Hope, Cory, Crossroads Community, Crothersville, Dale, Evansville Faith, Evansville Grace, Faith Community, Family Fellowship, Freedom, Freetown, Georgetown, Grandview, Greencastle, Harmony Chapel, Heartland, House of Faith (Carbon), Jasper, Kurtz, Mackey, Nashville Parkview, New Albany Christ's Community, Newburgh, Oakland City, Odon, Orleans, Petersburg, Peter Switch, Point Township, Princeton New Life, Restoration, Rockport, Rockville, Shoals, Spencer, Springs Valley, St. Bernice, Stinesville, Sullivan, Tell City, Union Chapel, Valley Mission, Vincennes, Washington, Winslow, and Zion Community.

THANK YOU for "Being the Light" this past church year in your local communities and around the world.

It makes me sad to report that we had to cancel several mission activities this year that mean so much to our district. In addition to canceling the youth mission trip, we also had to cancel the Work & Witness (W&W) trip to Honduras that was scheduled for April. I appreciate the leadership of Doug Jones. We are anxiously awaiting a new date so the work can still happen. Please be praying that the details for this will work out for the fall. These trips are not possible without the Lifeline funds being donated. A Lifeline membership is \$40 for the year. This money is needed so the materials can be purchased for our W&W trips. We ask that each church strive to have a membership goal equal to 10% of your morning worship average attendance.

Dave Lynn was able to make a trip in September to deliver Crisis Care Kits to the warehouse in Pennsylvania. He has made 26 trips for SWID so far! We appreciate his dedication to this ministry. Unfortunately the spring trip and collection of Crisis Care Kits had to be canceled.

We hope to resume this very important project soon. Dave was still able to take 60 boxes which is 360 crisis care kits. If churches have boxes ready to send, please go ahead and send them to the warehouse. We are not sure when another trip can be planned.

Our spring missionary tour was scheduled to begin April 1. Unfortunately, Covid-19 appeared just weeks before this. Janet Ritter spent countless hours preparing for this. We appreciate her hard work with this area. Please pray for Samuel and Supranee Yangmi as they continue to serve in Southeast Asia. At this time, we are not able to schedule a missionary tour for this next year. However, we are hoping this will change by the spring.

In the midst of this darkness and these cancellations, SWID was still able to be the Light in our local neighborhoods, around Southwest Indiana, throughout the United States, and globally. Here are just a few examples of what churches across SWID did this past year to shine His light brightly:

- **Calvary Community Fellowship** partnered with the Salvation Army and gave scarves, gloves, and hats as well as non-perishable food items.
- **House of Faith** helps support a backpack ministry for Clay County that helps feed students on the weekend and when they aren't in school.
- **Restoration** partnered with a local men's warming center to provide meals, volunteers, and supplies. They also raised enough funds to pay for a full-time staff member at the shelter.
- **Rockport** teaches a monthly missions curriculum to the children that attend there.
- **Valley Mission** set-up a booth at the county fair and sponsor several children through Nazarene Compassionate Ministries. As a district, forty-four churches sponsored children. This equals \$30,792.76. Thanks for being a light to these children around the world.
- **Zion Community** had two adults take a mission trip to Ecuador. They also donated goods and services to their local food pantry. Stay tuned to hear more about their support and work with the new women's shelter which is called Sojourn House. It is located right here on SWID.
- **Family Fellowship** has a Blessing Box located in front of their building. They keep this full of hygiene supplies, food, books, clothes, shoes, etc. Throughout the year, people come all hours of the day to give a blessing or receive a blessing. This church is also working on gathering items for the Appalachian Outreach Program in Eastern Kentucky,
- **Columbus First** partners with a Nazarene District in Honduras. They also help serve the homeless and less fortunate during the month of April at a hot meal site in town. The church partners with the Clothesline ministry that provides clothing for children that enter the foster care system in Bartholomew County. The clothes are washed and stored at the church.
- SWID gave 70 diaper bags to Karen's Place Maternity Center as part of the Appalachian Outreach Program on the Eastern Kentucky District.
- **SWID NYI** gave \$2,000 to Appalachian Outreach Program!
- God continues to use the **Jesus Film** to reach thousands of people that have never heard the good news. SWID had sixteen churches that gave \$26,745.22 towards spreading the gospel through the Jesus Film.
- Thirty-four churches gave to **World Mission Broadcast**. SWID was able to raise \$6,622 to help produce programs in multiple languages and countries. Hello, Future!
- A total of \$254,803.81 was given through mission specials from our district.

Thank you, the people of SWID, for continuing to do your part, our part to “be witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”

There is a popular song out right now titled **Be a Light**. Here are some of the lyrics:

“In a time of war, be peace...
In a world full of hate, be a light...
Don’t hide in the dark, you were born to shine...
In a world full of hate, be a light...
In a place that needs change, make a difference...
In a world full of hate, BE A LIGHT.”

May our goal be to be that Light every day. May our lights never burn out. Mother Teresa once said, “Often you can see power lines running alongside the street. Unless current is flowing through them, there is no light. The power line is you and I! The current is God! We have the power to allow the current to flow through us and thus to generate the light of the world: JESUS - or to refuse to be used and, thus, allow the darkness to spread.” We are indeed the light of the world--but only if our switch is turned on.

My prayer and hope for this next year is that SWID will continue to be the Light for Jesus in this dark world! Remember, we aren’t called to shine our own light; we are called to reflect HIS!

I challenge all of us to be the light in the world that helps others see!

John 8:12 says, “Then Jesus again spoke to them, saying, ‘I am the Light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in the darkness, but will have the Light of life.’”

I know the principles we share across the district throughout the year can work because of your commitment to help students take the next step in their faith. Thank you! To Allyson, Asher, Levi... no doubt, the greatest sacrifice has been made by you. You've handled the extra hours in the office, a few more trips away for daddy with grace, understanding, and unwavering support. Allyson, not a day goes by I am not grateful for the opportunity God gave me to share life with you. You are the best!

And finally, thank you Jesus! You are my Savior, my Sanctifier, and my Sustainer. You have proven time and time again your grace is sufficient. Your presence has never wavered and always remained constant throughout the year. I am forever grateful!

SO...Where do we grow from here???

I met with Pastor Tim early this year, before the world was shaken up, to talk about plans for our 2020 NYI Convention. I shared with him then how I felt the Lord was leading me to share a word about proximity; nearness in space, time, or relationship. The irony of this topic connected with the situation our world faces is not lost on me. And yet I wonder...could the Lord still be inviting us to consider new ways to draw near to Him and minister in new ways in order to continue to draw near the lost, the broken, the voiceless? At a time of great caution concerning physical space (appropriately so!), what does it look like to live in proximity to God, our neighbor, our communities?

God, out of His great love for humanity, showed us what proximity looked like by coming near to us, moving into our neighborhood (John 1:14, Philippians 2:1-11). In our moment of despair, God draws near! Jesus went to Zacchaeus' house. He touched the leper. He invited the kids to come. He spent his last meal dining with the betrayer, the denier, those who would desert him in his greatest hour of need. And ultimately, he provided the way for us to draw near to God through his death and resurrection. God demonstrated how much he desires us to be near to Him by coming near to us! Proximity is messy, isn't it? It is easier to keep your distance. However, when you get close, darkness becomes illuminated, the lost are given a name, their "problems" become our problems, "issues" have a face. Being near another requires a lot of prayer, time, and great sacrifice. Jesus is not asking us to do anything he has not already done for us! We can no longer stay on our side of the street, but are invited by God to stop, cross the street and try to make a difference in our world by drawing near the lost and the broken (Luke 10:25-37). This is what love requires! Jonathan David Smith says, "Proximity dispels ignorance and creates collaboration, understanding and compassion." Although we face challenges like never before to proximity within space, I still believe the message and hope of living in proximity to God and others is critical in these days! There are a few ways I believe it would be good for us to consider proximity across our district.

We must begin by talking about our need to draw near to God. One thing I know about the future is this—we don't know much about what the future holds for our country and world! With so much uncertainty, I am grateful we don't have to step into tomorrow alone. As questions about our new normal abound, we serve a God who is not shaken by uncertainty. He is trustworthy and will lead us! But we must be willing to draw near to Him. **WE HAVE THE BEST YOUTH WORKERS ON OUR DISTRICT!** Pastor, SS teacher, quiz coach, youth worker, college student trying to find your way...these are trying days in many ways. Are you tired? I get it! Don't let the enemy tempt you into believing you aren't making a difference. **YOU ARE!** Now is not the time to give up on the next generation. Keep fighting for their hearts. God is still at work! Stay near to Him. Remember, we cannot lead students to a place we are not. Is your talking about God outpacing your listening and talking to God? Continue to carve out space in your daily routine to pause and draw near to Him! We want to continue to offer training, resources, and the space to rest in God's goodness to our youth workers throughout the year. If you are like me, you are open to any tips and resources to meet students where they are living! Mark your calendar for September 19, 2020 for the **National Day of Volunteer Youth Ministry Training**. There will be locations all across the district where you can join thousands of youth workers from across the nation coming together to rest within the grace of God and grow in our understanding of how best to minister to students and families in these days.

When talking about proximity, we have to consider where students spend most of their time. Students spend majority of their time at home and at school. To reach students with the good news of Jesus, it begs us to consider how do we better partner with parents, guardians, grandparents, families as well as schools? There are a couple of resources that we will be sharing more about throughout this year to help in these areas.

We have been reminded the last few months of the importance and significance of spiritual formation within the home. **Axis** is an organization that is committed to helping caring adults navigate teen culture through a biblical lens to equip them for meaningful conversations that build lifelong connections. Axis has produced a lot of great resources to help families navigate our culture with a Christ-centered perspective; parent guides, conversation kits, culture translator among other things. Normally a church would pay \$1,000 in order to have access to their resources. We are excited to share through a partnership Central Field NYI has made with Axis, your church can receive access to ALL their content to share with any family in your church and community for \$50 this year!

Although access to schools may look a little different this fall, there are still opportunities for our students to reach their campus for Christ. I mentioned earlier I felt God laying this on my heart in January. At a District Leadership Conference in March, Justin Pickard, USA/Canada NYI Director, shared a similar vision for the upcoming year for all of USA/Canada. What would it look like if every youth group, every church across our district (and country) adopted a school in order to spread an unstoppable movement of prayer, care, and sharing the good news of Jesus at our schools? With the help of **Campus Alliance** (www.everyschool.com), **Campus Mission** (<https://nyiconnect.com/campus-mission/>) and connecting with one another (as many of you are already doing this well!), I believe we can make an impact like never before at our middle schools, high schools, colleges and universities.

Danielle Strickland says, "Jesus' example is always to send us, always to lead us across divisional lines. Let us go to the other side. Proximity is a key that opens the door to mutuality. Jesus is always inviting us to follow Him to places we wouldn't normally go. Don't be afraid - let love lead you." May God give us the courage to love as he has loved us!

I want to close the same way I have closed my previous four reports with a very simple, yet powerful prayer. May these words be true of all of our hearts today...

O Creator and mighty God, You have promised strength for the weak, rest for the laborers, light for the way, grace for the trials, help from above, unfailing sympathy, undying love.
O Creator and mighty God, help us to continue in your promise. Amen.

9.0 Local Church:

- 9.1 That the recommendations concerning the local church, Items 9.1 through 9.18 be read in full to the local church board at the first meeting after the district assembly, by the local church board secretary.
- 9.2 That each local church set aside at least \$50 per month during this quadrennium to assist their pastor and spouse in attending the General Assembly. This fund would be for the pastor of the local church at the time of the General Assembly.
- 9.3 That the local church pays the pastor's utility bills.
- 9.4 That the local church gives the pastor an amount equal to his or her total Social Security.
- 9.5 That each pastor be given paid vacations based on the following years of service: two weeks in the first five years of ministry, three weeks for five to ten years of ministry, ~~and~~ four weeks for more than ten years of ministry, and five weeks for 25 years of ministry and beyond. In case of a pastor or staff member resigning in the midst of a church year, the pay for vacation will be prorated.
- 9.6 That the local church pays the supply pastor an honorarium (\$100 suggested) plus mileage.
- 9.7 That the local church pays the expense of the pastor and ministry staff (and their spouses) to all district functions. Also, that the church makes childcare provisions as needed for pastoral families attending such events.
- 9.8 That the local church board secretary, at their February board meeting, or at the time of the annual budget review, delegate to a finance committee, the review of their pastor's salary. A minimum salary increase equal to the cost of living increase is recommended. At the next board meeting, this committee's report is to be made an item on the agenda. The local church secretary is to report the action taken by the local church, in writing, to the district superintendent.
- 9.9 That each local church understands that ministry mileage in the pastor's car and other professional expenses are local church expenses and should be reimbursed in keeping with IRS guidelines.
- 9.10 That each church pays its pastoral staff and dependent's health insurance premiums, if an ACA-compliant group health plan is feasible, or adjusts their salaries to consider insurance premiums and health care costs if such a plan is not a viable option.
- 9.11 That the local church board consider the paid ministry staff's benefits.
- 9.12 That the local church gives the pastor at Christmas time an amount equal to one week's salary or receive a love offering for the pastor.
- 9.13 That all treasurers of all departments of the local church use the services of a banking system.
- 9.14 That all accounts shall be in the name of the local church.
- 9.15 That the church establishes a Literature Fund for HOLINESS TODAY, unless otherwise provided for.
- 9.16 That careful attention be given to the salary of our evangelists with a minimum of 200

percent of the pastor's salary per Sunday of the meeting; also, that an amount equal to the evangelist's Social Security be given. Further, that the church where the evangelist holds membership and pays his tithe assist the evangelist financially with his expense to the General Assembly. The amount of such assistance is to be decided by the church board.

- 9.17 That we strongly encourage each local church to give financial help to their students attending Nazarene colleges, Nazarene universities, and the Nazarene Theological Seminary.

10.0 Missional Growth

- 10.1 That \$3,000 be set aside for ~~DCPI & Exponential~~ training.
- 10.2 That \$1,000 be set aside for insurance expense, and \$10,000 for church closure.
- 10.3 That \$5,000 be set aside for Mission Area Directors expense.
- 10.4 That \$33,500 be set aside for new endeavors with \$3,500 for Evansville Beacon (Haitian ministry), \$5000 for Compassion & Hope House, and \$25,000 for other new endeavors.
- 10.5 That \$3,000 be set aside for district assistance.
- 10.6 That \$250 be set aside to audit our missional growth account.
- 10.7 That we set aside \$2,500 for legal fees relating to new works and church closures.
- 10.8 That we set aside \$200 for office supplies and \$ 500 for New Church Task force expenses.

PROGRAM COMMITTEE REPORT

The District Program Committee has been charged with the responsibility of the issues in the Christian Action, Christian Education, and Church Growth reports. With responsibility to this task, we address:

a. Christian Action

We recommend:

1. That our pastors and church leaders inform their churches concerning the stand of the Church of the Nazarene on the subject of present day moral and social issues as stated in the Covenant of Christian Character (MANUAL, Church of the Nazarene, 2017-2021, Paragraphs 21-21.3) and the Covenant of Christian Conduct (MANUAL, Church of the Nazarene, 2017-2021, Paragraphs 28-35).
2. That we remind the pastor of her or his obligation to the congregation as stated in MANUAL, Church of the Nazarene, 2017-2021, Paragraphs 514-522.
3. That we reaffirm the Biblical view that the family is central to healthy children, relationships, churches, communities and societies. That every child needs and deserves their mother and father loving each other and loving them for their entire lives. That any sexual immorality, as stated in MANUAL Church of the Nazarene, Paragraph 31, attacks the family integrity and destroys people, families and societies.
4. That we stand against the legalization and practice of gambling, including such forms as the lottery, paremutuel betting, casino and riverboat gambling, knowing that it preys on the poor in society with false hope of riches.
5. That we stand against the production and consumption of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products and other drugs used for self-fulfillment, knowing that it increases neglect, abuse, injury and death of the innocent, and is a destructive substitute for fulfillment in Christ.
6. That we call our people to discipline themselves in the areas of what they read, view and hear. Let us use the instruction of Susannah Wesley to her son, John; namely, "Whatever weakens your reason, impairs the tenderness of your conscience, obscures your sense of God, or takes off the relish of spiritual things, whatever increases the authority of the body over the mind, that thing for you is sin."
7. That we uphold voluntary prayer and Bible reading in public schools. We affirm our support of students and faculty who endeavor to maintain a public witness for Jesus Christ in the educational institutions.
8. That we support the MANUAL, Church of the Nazarene, 2017-2021 statement (Paragraphs 30-30.1) on abortion and oppose the use of public funds to provide for abortion. Since life is God-given and sacred, we also take a stand against euthanasia.
9. We encourage our people to engage in civil affairs and to be in community service organizations in order that the principles of Christian ethics and morality be represented. We further urge our people to participate in the electoral processes and consider running for public office.

b. Christian Education

We recommend:

1. That we promote a life of regular Bible reading, prayer and listening to God in our homes where Christian education begins. We encourage our churches to support programs such as Bible quizzing that promotes a regular study of the scripture in the home.
2. That each church receive an offering for the Nazarene Bible College and the Nazarene Theological Seminary. All churches on the Southwest Indiana District are expected to support Olivet Nazarene University. We encourage our church boards to work with Nazarene employees of companies with matching fund programs to maximize the financial support of Olivet Nazarene University.
3. That our churches emphasize the importance of Christian education on the local level by providing discipleship classes for all ages. That our churches offer other small group Bible learning and support groups that reach outside the walls of the church. We urge all churches to conduct a Vacation Bible School or Children's Crusade. We encourage the use of the online "Discipleship Place" (<http://www.thediscipleshipplace.org>) training by the General Church SDMI. We also urge the use of Nazarene literature in all Christian Education in order that the tenets of our faith and the doctrines of the Church of the Nazarene are accurately presented and taught to all ages in the church.
4. That each church promote attendance at district SDMI training opportunities to provide the best possible education in our churches.
5. That our churches support Olivet Nazarene University, which is our regional university, with our finances, prayers and participation. We especially urge churches to support those with a call to full time ministry as they attend Nazarene institutions.

c. Church Growth

We recommend:

1. That every church support the district and general (WEF) budgets in full, because collectively we can accomplish more for Christ and His Kingdom.
2. That every year, the pastor and the church board shall conduct a planning session to renew the expectations and goals of the church and the pastor as per required by MANUAL, Church of the Nazarene, 2017-2021, paragraph.
3. That each local church reach outside the walls to begin new ministries and reach those that are not coming through the doors of the church.
4. That each church consider supporting broader outreach ministries such as a church plant, Parent Affiliated Congregation (PAC), or Compassionate Ministry Center.
5. That each local church conduct revivals, mission area gatherings, and participate in other church renewal and energization activities. We recommend the use of Nazarene evangelists in these meetings.
6. That each local church strive, each year, to achieve the new Nazarene goal based on the active membership at the last assembly year.
