Washing Dirty Feet

A NOTE FROM PASTOR TIM CRUMP

I have often wondered what it would have been like to watch Jesus as He went through life. It would have been interesting to see the expression on His face as the disciples argued about who was the greatest among them. Did Jesus ever sigh or simply shake His head in disbelief? Did a tear or two roll down His cheeks as He recognized that even those closest to Him did not comprehend who He was and what He was about to do?

In the days of Jesus, one of the lowliest tasks a servant or slave had was washing dirty feet. Since the primary mode of transportation was walking, one can easily imagine how dirty feet could become, as well as the necessity for washing feet upon entering a home. The gospels mention one such occasion involving Jesus and His disciples. Much to the amazement of the disciples – whose feet were dirty – Jesus gets up and begins washing their feet, entering into the role of a servant. If you were one of the disciples that day, how would you feel watching Jesus go around the room? What about when He begins to wash your own dirty feet?

Then Jesus declares:

"Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them."
